The Iron Horse and the Constitution Richard C. The Wanderer Erik Calonius 2007-04-01 On Nov. 28, 1858, a ship called the Wanderer slipped silently into a coastal channel and unloaded its cargo of over 400 African slaves onto Jekyll Island, Georgia, thirty eight years after the African slave trade had been made illegal.
