### *Strategies for Effective Teaching - ed*

Observational activities permit teachers to view alternative teaching strategies and behaviors as demonstrated by peers or allow peer teachers to observe what is taking place in another's classroom. (A peer teacher may be any teaching colleague who possesses the desired teaching behavior and is willing to share his or her knowledge with others.)

### **The Role of Critical Reflection in Teacher Education**

deliberate reflection and analysis regarding those events that may lead to formulating new strategies for changing behavior in the classroom (Reagan et al., 2000), he or she is using reflection for professional growth. Brookfield (2004) argued that without reflection, teachers run the continual risk of making poor decisions and bad judgments.
