THE CANADIAN SLAVE CONTEXT SEEMS TO HAVE ALLOWED A BROADER RANGE OF MATERIAL COMFORT AS WELL. WHITENESS AND INDIGENEITY ARE ARTICULATED THROUGH FOUR ICONS OF CANADIAN IDENTITY -- THE BEAVER, THE RAILWAY, THE WILDERNESS OF BANFF NATIONAL PARK, AND "INDIANNES" -- AND THE CONTRADICTION AND CONTESTED MEANINGS THEY EVOKE. THESE SEEMINGLY BENIGN, EVEN KITSCHY, IMAGES, SHE ARGUES, ARE HAUNTED BY IDEAS ABOUT RACE, MASCULINITY, AND SEXUALITY THAT CIRCULATED DURING THE FORMATIVE YEARS OF ANGLO-CANADIAN NATIONHOOD. JUXTAPOSING THESE NOSTALGIC IMAGES WITH THE WORK OF CONTEMPORARY CANADIAN ARTISTS, SHE INVESTIGATES HOW EVERYDAY OBJECTS CAN BE RE-IMAGINED TO CHALLENGE IDEAS ABOUT HISTORY, MEMORY, AND NATIONAL IDENTITY.

CRITICAL EVALUATION OF THESE WORKS SHEDS LIGHT ON THE COMPLEXITY OF THESE DEPICTIONS. THE CONTRIBUTORS IN NATIONAL PLOTS: HISTORICAL FICTION AND CHANGING IDEAS OF CANADA CRITICALLY EXAMINE TEXTS WITH SUBJECT MATTER RANGING FROM GEORGE VANCOUVER'S WEST COAST EXPLORATIONS TO THE ERADICATION OF THE BEOTHUK IN NEWFOUNDLAND. REFLECTING DIVERSE METHODOLOGIES AND THEORETICAL APPROACHES, THE ESSAYS SEEK TO EXPLICATE DEPICTIONS OF "THE HISTORICAL" IN INDIVIDUAL TEXTS AND TO EXPLORE LARGER QUESTIONS RELATING TO HISTORICAL FICTION AS A GENRE WITH COMPLEX AND DIVERGENT POLITICAL MOTIVATIONS AND GOALS.
