In the 1990s, a political movement of transgender activism coalesced to campaign for transgender rights. Transgender persons are one such group of people who have been marginalized, abused, disdained and callously neglected community in almost every known society. The term —transgender is generally used to describe those who transgress social gender norms. Transgender is often used as an umbrella term to signify individuals who defy rigid, binary gender constructions and who expresses or present a breaking and blurring of culturally prevalent stereotypically gender roles. It includes pre-operative, post-operative and non- operative transsexual people who strongly identify with gender opposite to their biological sex. Transgender are known locally 'laanch' in Kashmir.
