Two ancillary sections of the organization are the Jungvolk, the segment for the youngsters of pre-secondary school age, and the Alterenbund, for those who have graduated and are pursuing careers in business, the university, and such. The organization was founded in 1919. Its course was relatively stormy until 1924, after which a short respite occurred in which an attempt was made at a unique synthesis. That synthesis can be summarized in the phrase, "Catholic youth movement." Neudeutschland sought to catholicize the "healthy" aspects of the German youth movement which had grown after 1900 and which had swept through the secondary schools of Protestant northern Germany prior to the First World War. After the war, the impetus towards youth movement greatly enhanced by the shattering of the old, restricting authority spread among the Catholic students in the secondary schools.
