**Historical Dictionaries in their Paratextual Context** Roderick McConchie 2018-09-24 Both dictionary and paratext research have emerged recently as widely-recognised research areas of intrinsic interest. This collection represents an attempt to place dictionaries within the paratextual context for the first time.
