This edition was translated by Samuel Liddell MacGregor Mathers and published by Aleister Crowley under the title *The Book of the Goetia of Solomon the King*. Crowley added some additional invocations previously unrelated to the original work, as well as essays describing the rituals as psychological exploration instead of demon summoning.
