There are different services to help you manage your day-to-day activities. Depending on your needs,

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you may be eligible to receive: y transport to appointments and activities y domestic help (e.g. house cleaning, washing clothes) y personal care (e.g. help with showering or dressing) y home maintenance (e.g. changing light bulbs, gardening)
