NEW PERSPECTIVES ON RACIAL IDENTITY DEVELOPMENT CHARMAINE WIJJEYESINGHE 2012-07-30 FOR WELL OVER A CENTURY, THE UNITED FRUIT COMPANY (UFCO) HAS BEEN THE MOST VILIFIED MULTINATIONAL CORPORATION OPERATING IN LATIN AMERICA. CRITICISM OF THE UFCO HAS BEEN WIDESPREAD, RANGING FROM POLITICIANS TO CONSUMER ACTIVISTS, AND FROM LABOR LEADERS TO HISTORIANS, ALL PORTRAYING IT AS AN OVERWHELMINGLY POWERFUL CORPORATION THAT SHAPED AND OFTEN EXPLOITED ITS HOST COUNTRIES. IN THIS FIRST HISTORY OF THE UFCO IN COLOMBIA, MARCELO BUCHELI ARGUES THAT THE UFCO'S IMAGE AS AN ALL-POWERFUL FORCE IN DETERMINING NATIONAL POLITICS NEEDS TO BE RECONSIDERED. USING A PREVIOUSLY UNEXPLORED SOURCE—THE INTERNAL ARCHIVES OF COLOMBIA'S UFCO OPERATION—BUCHELI REVEALS THAT BEFORE 1930, THE UFCO WORKED ALONGSIDE A BUSINESS-FRIENDLY GOVERNMENT THAT GRANTED IT GENEROUS CONCESSIONS AND REPPRESSED LABOR UNIONISM.

AFTER 1930, HOWEVER, THE COUNTRY EXPERIENCED DRAMATIC TRANSFORMATIONS INCLUDING GROWING NATIONALISM, A STRONGER LABOR MOVEMENT, AND INCREASING DEMANDS BY LOCAL ELITES FOR HIGHER STAKES IN THE BANANA EXPORT BUSINESS. IN RESPONSE TO THESE CIRCUMSTANCES, THE COMPANY ABANDONED PRODUCTION, SELLING ITS PLANTATIONS (AND LABOR CONFLICTS) TO LOCAL GROWERS, WHILE TRANSFORMING ITSELF INTO A MARKETING COMPANY. THE SHIFT WAS ENDORSED BY THE COMPANY'S SHAREHOLDERS AND FINANCIAL ANALYSTS, WHO PREFERRED LOWER PROFITS WITH LOWER RISKS, AND CAME AT A TIME IN WHICH THE DEMAND FOR BANANAS WAS DECREASING IN AMERICA. IMPORTANTLY, BUCHELI SHOWS THAT THE EFFECT OF FOREIGN DIRECT INVESTMENT WAS NOT UNIDIRECTIONAL. INSTEAD, THE AGENCY OF LOCAL ACTORS AFFECTED CORPORATE STRATEGY, JUST AS THE UFCO ALSO TRANSFORMED LOCAL POLITICS AND SOCIETY.

HISPANAS DE QUEENS MILAGROS RICOURT 2003 WHAT HAPPENS WHEN PERSONS OF SEVERAL LATIN AMERICAN NATIONAL GROUPS RESIDE IN THE SAME NEIGHBORHOOD-- MILAGROS RICOURT AND RUBY DANTA CONSIDER THE STORIES OF WOMEN OF DIFFERENT NATIONALITIES--COLOMBIAN, CUBAN, DOMINICAN, ECUADORIAN, PERUVIAN, PUERTO RICAN, URUGUAYAN, AND OTHERS--WHO LIVE TOGETHER IN CORONA, A WORKING-CLASS NEIGHBORHOOD IN QUEENS. CORONA HAS LONG BEEN AN ARRIVAL POINT FOR IMMIGRANTS AND IS NOW MADE UP PREDOMINANTLY OF SPANISH-SPEAKING IMMIGRANTS FROM THE CARIBBEAN AND SOUTH AND CENTRAL AMERICA, WITH SMALLER NUMBERS FROM ASIA, AFRICA, AND EUROPE. THERE ARE ALSO LONG-ESTABLISHED POPULATIONS OF WHITE AMERICANS, MAINLY OF ITALIAN ORIGIN, AND AFRICAN AMERICANS. THE AUTHORS FIND THAT THE NEW PAN-LATIN AMERICAN COMMUNITY IN CORONA HAS EMERGED FROM THE INTERACTIONS OF EVERYDAY LIVING. HISPANAS DE QUEENS FOCUSES ON THE PLACES WHERE WOMEN GATHER IN CORONA--BODEGAS, HOSPITALS, SCHOOLYARDS, AND ROMAN CATHOLIC AND PROTESTANT CHURCHES--TO SHOW HOW INFORMAL ALLIANCES ARISE FROM PROXIMITY. RICOURT AND DANTA DOCUMENT HOW A GROUP OF LEADERS, MAINLY WOMEN, CONSCIOUSLY PROMOTED THIS STRONG SENSE OF COMMUNITY TO BUILD PANETHNIC ORGANIZATIONS AND A LATINO POLITICAL VOICE. HISPANAS DE QUEENS SHOWS HOW A NEW GROUP IDENTITY--HISPANIC OR LATINO--IS FORMED WITHOUT REPLACING AN INDIVIDUAL'S IDENTIFICATION AS AN IMMIGRANT FROM A PARTICULAR COUNTRY. INSTEAD, AN ADDITIONAL IDENTITY IS CREATED AND CAN BE MOBILIZED BY PAN-LATINO LEADERS AND ORGANIZATIONS.

SELLING THE LOWER EAST SIDE CHRISTOPHER MELE 2000 THE LOWER EAST SIDE OF MANHATTAN IS RICH IN STORIES -- OF POOR IMMIGRANTS WHO FLOCKED THERE IN THE LATE NINETEENTH AND EARLY TWENTIETH CENTURIES; OF BEATNIKS, HIPPIES, AND ARTISTS WHO PEOPLED IT MID-CENTURY; AND OF THE REAL ESTATE DEVELOPERS AND POLITICIANS WHO HAVE ALWAYS SHAPED WHAT IS NOW TERMED THE "EAST VILLAGE". TODAY, THE MUSICAL RENT PLAYS ON BROADWAY TO A MOSTLY WHITE AND SUBURBAN AUDIENCE, MTV EXPLOITS THE NEIGHBORHOOD'S NEWLY TRENDY SQUALOR IN A FILM PROMOTION, AND ON THE INTERNET A CYBER SOAP OPERA AND TRAVEL-RELATED WEB PAGES LURE MEMBERS OF THE MIDDLE CLASS TO ENJOY A COMMODIFIED AND SANITIZED VERSION OF THE NEIGHBORHOOD. IN THIS SWEEPING ACCOUNT, CHRISTOPHER MELE ANALYZES THE POLITICAL AND CULTURAL FORCES THAT HAVE INFLUENCED THE DEVELOPMENT OF THIS DISTINCTIVE COMMUNITY. HE DESCRIBES LATE NINETEENTH-CENTURY NOTIONS OF THE LOWER EAST SIDE AS A PLACE OF ENTRENCHED POVERTY, ETHNIC PLURALITY, POLITICAL ACTIVISM, AND "LOW" CULTURE THAT ELICITED FEELINGS OF REVULSION AND FEAR AMONG THE CITY'S ELITE AND MIDDLE CLASSES. THE RESULTING -- AND ONGOING -- STRUGGLE BETWEEN GOVERNMENT AND RESIDENTS OVER AFFORDABLE AND DECENT HOUSING HAS IN TURN AFFECTED REAL ESTATE PRACTICES AND URBAN DEVELOPMENT POLICIES. SELLING THE LOWER EAST SIDE RECOUNTS THE RESISTANCE TACTICS USED BY COMMUNITY RESIDENTS, AS WELL AS THE IMPULSE ON THE PART OF SOME TO PERPETUATE THE IMAGE OF THE NEIGHBORHOOD AS DANGEROUS, ROMANTIC, AND BOHEMIAN, CLINGING TO THE MARGINALITY THAT HAS BEEN CENTRAL TO THE IDENTITY OF THE EAST VILLAGE AND SUBVERTING ATTEMPTS TO PORTRAY IT AS "NEW AND IMPROVED". IRONICALLY, THIS VERY IMAGE OF URBAN GRITTIENESS HAS BEEN APPROPRIATED BY A CULTURAL MARKETPLACE HUNGRY FOR NEW FODDER. MELE EXPLORES THE WAYS THAT DEVELOPERS, MEDIA EXECUTIVES, AND OTHERS HAVE COOPTED THE AREA'S CHARACTERISTICS -- ANALYZING THE EAST VILLAGE AS A "STYLE PROVIDER" WHERE WHAT IS BEING MARKETED IS "DIFFERENCE". THE RESULT IS A VISIONARY LOOK AT HOW POLITICAL AND ECONOMIC ACTIONS TRANSFORM NEIGHBORHOODS AND AT WHAT HAPPENS WHEN A NEIGHBORHOOD IS WHAT IS BEING "CONSUMED".
