THESE WERE ALSO, HOWEVER, YEARS OF PERSONAL TRIBULATION. THE ONCE-TIGHT FROST FAMILY BROKE UP AS MARRIAGE, ILLNESS, AND WORK SCATTERED THE CHILDREN ACROSS THE COUNTRY. IN THE CASE OF FROST'S SON CAROL, BOTH DISTANCE AND PROXIMITY PUT STRAINS ON AN ALREADY FRACTIOUS RELATIONSHIP. BUT THE TRAGEDY AND EMOTIONAL CRUX OF THIS VOLUME IS THE DEATH, IN MONTANA, OF FROST'S YOUNGEST DAUGHTER, MARJORIE.
