Mettray Stephen A. Toth 2019-11-15 The Mettray Penal Colony was a private reformatory without walls, established in France in 1840 for the rehabilitation of young male delinquents. Foucault linked its opening to the most significant change in the modern status of prisons and now, at last, Stephen Toth takes us behind the gates to show how the institution legitimized France's repression of criminal youth and added a unique layer to the nation's carceral system. Drawing on insights from sociology, criminology, critical theory, and social history, Stephen Toth dissects Mettray's social anatomy, exploring inmates'

experiences. More than 17,000 young men passed through the reformatory before its closure, and Toth situates their struggles within changing conceptions of childhood and adolescence in modern France. Mettray demonstrates that the colony was an ill-conceived project marked by internal contradictions. Its social order was one of subjection and subversion, as officials struggled for order and inmates struggled for autonomy. Toth's formidable archival work exposes the nature of the relationships between, and among, prisoners and administrators. He explores the daily grind of existence: living conditions, discipline, labor, sex, and violence. Thus, he gives voice to the incarcerated, not simply to the incarcerators, whose ideas and agendas tend to dominate the historical record. Mettray is, above all else, a deeply personal illumination of life inside France's most venerated carceral institution.

Histoire de la savate, du chausson et de la boxe française, 1797-1978 : d'une pratique populaire à un sport de compétition Jean-François Loudcher 2000 La boxe française moderne, discipline de combat de percussion pied-poing, est devenue un sport de compétition après bien des avatars. Ses origines remontent au début du XIXe siècle, période où le peuple parisien lui donne vie en l'appelant " savate " ou " chausson ". La pratique est alors essentiellement

ournée vers l'auto-défense et ses représentants les plus fameux sont Michel dit Pisseux et L. Leboucher. Puis, elle évolue dans deux directions : d'une part, vers une forme saltimbanque avec, notamment, l'influence de L. Vigneron et de Rambaud, et d'autre part, vers une pratique gymnastique avec les frères Lecour. Se surajoute, dans les années 1870, le modèle de Joinville avec la célèbre leçon sur les quatre faces : il étend principalement son influence sur l'Ecole et l'Armée. Enfin, au tournant du siècle, cette discipline connaît une certaine stabilité avec la boxe française académique des Charlemont malgré quelques formes concurrentes comme la boxe française de combat développée par Leclerc, Chabrier, Léon, etc... Ce n'est qu'à la Libération et avec la fin progressive du long monopole Charlemont que renaît la boxe française. Elle débouche sur la pratique compétitive de combat unifiée des années 70 après bien des dissensions internes. Cet art pugilistique a donc connu un long processus de sportivisation dont cette étude s'attache à rendre compte. En particulier, elle se propose d'expliquer les origines de la savate qui est une pratique sans équivalent au niveau européen ainsi que ses mutations. Elle tente en outre de retracer l'histoire de cette discipline et celle de ses pratiquants en relation avec leur contexte social, politique, culturel et géographique sur la base d'analyses d'archives ainsi que de nombreux entretiens. Like all martial arts Savate has undergone innumerable changes over time to adapt it to the needs of a given period. When used by the hardscrabble sailors of Toulon, Marseilles, Algiers and La Havre it took into account the use of the ropes and rigging found on tall ships to aid in wild looping boot-strikes delivered with a cutlass in one hand. The bold highwaymen of the vast French interior adapted it to their own needs when plundering coaches with a knife and pistol at their side. Just before the turn of the 19th century in Paris it had become a polite exercise in gymnastics for the bourgeoisie and idle noblemen. But things had changed in the capital, and the members of the upper crust were no longer in command of the streets as desperate young men formed street gangs such as the "Apaches" to rob and terrorize the moneyed classes. J. Charlemont responded to the situation by restoring Savate to combat readiness. He stripped away the polite feats of gymnastics to restore what lay at the core of what was after all a martial art. Along with his stick fighting system called La Canne he armed the French

gentleman (who always carried a cane after all for the purpose of chasing off dogs, knocking aside horse dung, pointing at things, and looking dapper while wielding this wooden specter of the once universal sword) with a curriculum that would, with the aid of a well made pair of boots, send a hooligan crashing to the cobblestones with a smashed ankle or dislocated patella. He would then give the poor fellow's accomplice a good cane-thrashing with a strokes to be found in the companion volume to the this one regarding La Canne.
