La Alhambra y El Alcázar de Sevilla Charles River Charles River Editors 2018-05-09 Escondida en la cima de la colina Al-Sabika en Granada, región de Andalucía, España, al lado de la rumorosa corriente del río Darro, hay una estructura majestuosa con vista a la encantadora ciudad y a los místicos prados de La Vega. Un cinturón principal de asteroides ha sido bautizado con el nombre de este lugar de leyenda. La exquisita obra de arte sigue siendo adorada, tanto así que una campaña de 2007 atrajo al lugar una multitud calculada en 5.000 personas. Allí, ellos unieron sus manos y formaron un anillo de casi 5 kilómetros alrededor de la espectacular fortaleza, con la esperanza de consolidar el monumento como una de las "Siete nueve maravillas del mundo." Dejando a un lado la asombrosa belleza, lo que hace de la Alhambra una de las eternas joyas clásicas de toda Europa es el rico tapiz de historia que se despliega en las paredes del centenario paraíso palaciego.
