**Machine Habitus** Massimo Airoidi 2021-12-13 We commonly think of society as made of and by humans, but with the proliferation of machine learning and AI technologies, this is clearly no longer the case. **Industrial Society and Its Future** Theodore Kaczynski 2019-10-23 In 1995, Kaczynski mailed several letters to media outlets outlining his goals and demanding that his 35,000-word essay *Industrial Society and Its Future* (dubbed the Unabomber Manifesto by the FBI) be printed verbatim by a major newspaper. He stated that, if this demand was met, he would "desist from terrorism". There was controversy as to whether the essay should be published, but Attorney General Janet Reno and FBI Director Louis Freeh recommended its publication out of concern for public safety and in hope that a reader could identify the author. Bob Guccione of *Penthouse* volunteered to publish it, but Kaczynski replied that *Penthouse* was less "respectable" than the other publications. He said that he would "reserve the right to plant one (and only one) bomb intended to kill, after our manuscript has been published". The *New York Times* and *The Washington Post* both published the essay on September 19, 1995.
