QUICKLET ON ERNEST HEMINGWAY'S THE GARDEN OF EDEN JOSEPH PHILLIP PRITCHARD 2012-07-30 ABOUT THE BOOK IN OUR YOUTH WE ARE PRONE TO INDULGING IN THE IDEA OF LOVE. YOUNG LOVE IS PRIMARILY CONCERNED WITH PURITY, PASSION, AND UNCONDITIONAL CARE. ALL TOO OFTEN THE IMMATURE MIND GLOSSES OVER THE MORE PAINFUL MOMENTS CONNECTED TO LOVE AND ONLY REMEMBERS LOVE AS A BEAUTIFUL FORCE. BUT AS THOSE WHO HAVE LOVED AND LOST WILL ATTEST, LOVE IS RARELY THE BLISSFUL EMOTION THAT FAIRYTALES MAKE IT OUT TO BE. LOVE IS MESSY, AND SOMETIMES EVEN DANGEROUS IF MIXED WITH SOME MEASURE OF OBSESSION, AND A NEED TO CONTROL. SUCH IS THE CASE WITH ERNEST HEMINGWAY'S POSTHUMOUSLY PUBLISHED CLASSIC, *THE GARDEN OF EDEN*. *THE GARDEN OF EDEN* WAS RELEASED IN THE LATE 1980S, A LITTLE OVER TWO DECADES AFTER ERNEST HEMINGWAY'S DEATH. THE NOVEL'S POSTHUMOUS PUBLICATION FORCED READERS AND SCHOLARS TO RETHINK THEIR PERCEPTIONS OF ITS AUTHOR. EARLY CRITICS OF HEMINGWAY OFTEN PRAISED HIS MALE-CENTRIC VIEW OF THE WORLD. MOST OF HIS MEMORABLE CHARACTERS WERE MEN PERFORMING MASCULINE PURSUITS. MOST OF HIS WOMEN WERE PRESENTED AS CHARACTERS THAT WEAKENED THE MALE PROTAGONIST OR LEAD TO THE DETERIORATION OF HIS LIFE. HOWEVER, IN *THE GARDEN OF EDEN*, HEMINGWAY PRESENTS TWO FEMALE CHARACTERS (CATHERINE AND MARITA) WHO ARE BOTH NOT MOLDED TO FIT THE "WEAK" FEMALE CHARACTERS PORTRAYED IN HEMINGWAY'S OTHER NOVELS. IN FACT, CATHERINE IS OFTEN PRESENTED AS MORE "MANLY" THAN HER HUSBAND. THIS EXPLORATION OF GENDER ROLES, SEXUAL IDENTITY, AND SEXUAL DEVIANCE DRASTICALLY DEVIATED FROM WHAT WAS EXPECTED FROM HEMINGWAY THE NOVEL ALSO STIRRED UP MUCH CRITICISM ABOUT HOW IT WAS EDITED. THE FACT REMAINS THAT THE NOVEL WAS NEVER FINISHED. THIS BEGS THE QUESTION, HOW MUCH OF IT WAS EDITED OUT BEFORE FINALLY GETTING PUBLISHED? MOREOVER, WHAT OTHER CHANGES WOULD HEMINGWAY HAVE MADE IF HE HAD HAD THE CHANCE TO REVISE HIS WORK? SUCH HAS ALWAYS BEEN THE PROBLEM WITH POSTHUMOUSLY PUBLISHED WORK. WE MAY NEVER REALLY KNOW WHAT HEMINGWAY'S NOVEL MIGHT HAVE TURNED OUT TO BE. BUT THE MATERIAL THAT DID MAKE IT TO PRINT SEEMS TO SUGGEST THAT THIS PIECE WAS SOMETHING THAT WOULD HAVE BROKEN NEW GROUND FOR HIM. UNLIKE HIS PREVIOUS STORIES, *THE GARDEN OF EDEN* DIDN'T FOCUS ON SOME THRILLING, ALBEIT VICARIOUS, ADVENTURE. INSTEAD HEMINGWAY VENTURES INTO TERRITORY THAT SEEMS MORE THE PROVINCE OF ROMANCE NOVELISTS THAN AN AUTHOR OF HIS STATURE. MOREOVER, HIS TWO MAIN CHARACTERS SEEM TO GO AGAINST TYPE. PERHAPS REFLECTIVE OF THE STORY'S ROLE-REVERSING, GENDER-BENDING EXPLORATIONS, HEMINGWAY'S LEADING MALE CHARACTER, DAVID BOURNE, IS PASSIVE, WHILE HIS LEAD FEMALE, CATHERINE BOURNE, IS THE ONE PULLING THE STRINGS. THOSE FAMILIAR WITH HEMINGWAY'S PREVIOUSLY PUBLISHED NOVELS SUCH AS *A FAREWELL TO ARMS*, OR *FOR WHOM THE BELL TOLLS* WILL NOTE THAT WHILE HEMINGWAY HAS WRITTEN STRONG FEMALE LEADS BEFORE, HE HAS NEVER REALLY WRITTEN SUCH RELATIVELY TIMID MALE CHARACTERS. EXCERPT FROM THE BOOK AT THIS POINT IN THE NOVEL SOME READERS ARE PROBABLY WONDERING TO WHAT POINT AND PURPOSE HIGHLIGHTING SUCH AN INNOCUOUS, AND POSSIBLY TANGENTIAL, ELEMENT COULD HAVE ON THE STORY? HEMINGWAY MAY HAVE WANTED TO DEVELOP A STRONGER LINK BETWEEN THE ACT OF SATISFYING A PHYSIOLOGICAL NEED TO CONSUME FOOD WITH THE NEED TO SATISFY SEXUAL CRAVINGS. WHILE THIS OBSERVATION IS BY NO MEANS INTENDED TO BE A FREUDIAN INTERPRETATION, IT IS INTERESTING TO NOTE HOW REMARKABLY SIMILAR BOTH TYPES OF CRAVINGS CAN BE. MORE TO THE POINT, WHILE CRAFTING A LOVE SCENE AND A SCENE INVOLVING FOOD MAY SEEM DIFFERENT, THE WRITING SKILLS NEEDED TO BE ABLE TO ENGAGE A READER'S SENSES ARE THE SAME FOR BOTH. BEREFT OF ANY VISUALS, THE STORYTELLER MUST RELY PURELY ON THE POWER THEIR WORDS HAVE ON THE READER'S IMAGINATION. THESE INITIAL CHAPTERS FOCUS ON THE RELATIONSHIP THAT EXISTS BETWEEN THE CATHERINE AND DAVID.

SPACE WAS, THUS, UNDERSTOOD AS PHYSICAL, MECHANICAL, CONTINUOUS, LINEAR, AS MEASURABLE AND SYMBOLIC, AS SUBJECTIVE AND RELATIONAL, AND AS AESTHETIC. MEN ALONE JOPI NYMAN 1997 THIS STUDY EXAMINES MASCULINITY AND INDIVIDUALISM IN FOUR AMERICAN NOVELS OF THE 1920S AND 1930S USUALLY REGARDED AS BELONGING TO THE GENRE OF HARD-BOILED FICTION. THE NOVELS UNDER STUDY ARE *RED HARVEST* BY DASHIELL HAMMETT, *THE POSTMAN ALWAYS RINGS TWICE* BY JAMES M. CAIN, *THEY SHOOT HORSES, DON’T THEY?* BY HORACE MCCOY, AND *TO HAVE AND HAVE NOT* BY ERNEST HEMINGWAY. IN THIS FIRST FULL-LENGTH STUDY OF GENDER IN HARD-BOILED FICTION THE GENRE IS DISCUSSED AS A REPRESENTATION OF THE IDEOLOGIES OF MASCULINITY AND INDIVIDUALISM. HARD-BOILED FICTION IS LOCATED IN ITS HISTORICAL AND CULTURAL CONTEXT AND IT IS ARGUED THAT THE GENRE, WITH ITS EXPLICIT EMPHASIS ON MASCULINITY AND MASCULINE VIRTUES, ATTEMPTS TO REAFFIRM A MASCULINE ORDER. THE STUDY ARGUES THAT THIS EMPHASIS IS A COUNTER-REACTION TO MORE GENERAL CHANGES IN THE GENDER RELATIONS OF THE PERIOD. INDEED, HARD-BOILED FICTION IS ARGUED TO BE AN ATTEMPT TO RECONSTRUCT A MASCULINE IDENTITY BASED ON ANTI-MODERN VALUES GENERALLY ACCEPTED IN THE CULTURAL CONTEXT OF THE GENRE.

SEXED TEXTS PAUL BAKER 2008 *SEXED TEXTS* EXPLORES THE COMPLEX ROLE THAT LANGUAGE PLAYS IN THE CONSTRUCTION OF SEXUALITY AND GENDER, TWO CONCEPTS OFTEN DISCUSSED SEPARATELY BUT, IN PRACTICE, CLOSELY INTERTWINED. IT LOCATES SEXUALITY AND GENDER AS SOCIALLY CONSTRUCTED, AND EXAMINES LANGUAGE USE IN TERMS OF SOCIO-HISTORICAL FACTORS, LINKING CHANGING CONCEPTUALISATIONS OF IDENTITY, DISCOURSE AND DESIRE TO THEORIES SURROUNDING REGULATION, GLOBALISATION, NEW TECHNOLOGIES, MARKETISATION AND CONSUMERISM. THIS BOOK DRAWS ON A RANGE OF THEORETICAL PERSPECTIVES AND PUBLISHED RESEARCH, AND TAKES EXAMPLES FROM WRITTEN, SPOKEN, INTERNET, NON-VERBAL, VISUAL, MEDIASCRIPED AND NATURALLY OCCURRING TEXTS. TAKING A BROADLY DECONSTRUCTIONIST PERSPECTIVE, THE BOOK PROGRESSES FROM EXAMINING WHAT ARE SEEN AS PREFERABLE OR ACCEPTABLE WAYS TO EXPRESS GENDER AND SEXUALITY, MOVING TOWARDS MORE ‘TOLERATED’ IDENTITIES, PRACTICES AND DESIRES, AND FINALLY ARRIVING AT MARGINALIZED AND TABOOED FORMS. THE BOOK LOCATES SEXUALITY AND GENDER AS SOCIALLY CONSTRUCTED, AND THEREFORE EXAMINES LANGUAGE USE IN TERMS OF SOCIO-HISTORICAL FACTORS, LINKING CHANGING CONCEPTUALISATIONS OF IDENTITY, DISCOURSE AND DESIRE TO THEORIES SURROUNDING REGULATION, GLOBALISATION, NEW TECHNOLOGIES, MARKETISATION AND CONSUMERISM.

ERNEST HEMINGWAY'S MISTRESSES AND WIVES STEPHEN E. HENRICHON 2010 ABSTRACT: "CONFLICTED" SUCCINCTLY DESCRIBES ERNEST HEMINGWAY. HE HAD A STRONG DESIRE TO MAKE HIS PARENTS PROUD OF HIM BUT THIS WAS IN CONSTANT CONFLICT WITH HIS NEED TO TELL A STORY, WARTS AND ALL. OF PARTICULAR IMPORTANCE IS HIS RELATIONSHIP WITH HIS MOTHER

AND THE CRIPPLING EFFECT IT HAS ON HIS RELATIONSHIPS WITH WOMEN. HEMINGWAY'S LIFE BECOMES A SERIES OF DYSFUNCTIONAL RELATIONSHIPS THAT FAIL TO MEET HIS NEEDS, LEAVING HIM PERPETUALLY SEARCHING FOR THE RIGHT WOMAN. KERT POSITS THAT HEMINGWAY'S CONTEMPT FOR WOMEN IS RELATED TO HIS INABILITY TO MAKE THE TRANSITION FROM LOVER TO HUSBAND, FUELED BY HEMINGWAY'S BELIEF THAT HIS FATHER SURRENDERED HIS MANHOOD TO GRACE HEMINGWAY. ERNEST, HAUNTED BY HIS PARENTS' RELATIONSHIP CONTINUES TO ASSOCIATE NEGATIVE CONNOTATIONS WITH THE TERM "HUSBAND," LEAVING HEMINGWAY IN CONSTANT FEAR OF BECOMING HIS FATHER, POISONING HIS MARRIAGES, AND COLORING THE RELATIONSHIPS HEMINGWAY DEPICTS IN HIS SHORT STORIES. EVIDENT ACROSS THE ARC OF HEMINGWAY'S SHORT STORIES IS AN EVOLUTION IN HIS SKILL AS A WRITER, BUT ALSO IN THE DEVELOPMENT OF HIS FEMALE CHARACTERS. OVER HIS CAREER, HEMINGWAY DEVELOPS A FEMALE VOICE THAT RINGS TRUE, AND HE SKILLFULLY USES IT TO PORTRAY FEMALE CHARACTERS WHO ARE EVOLVING INTO STRONG SELF-RELIANT WOMEN. IN THESE STORIES, THERE IS A GRADUAL SHIFT IN THE DYNAMICS OF THE RELATIONSHIPS AS HEMINGWAY'S FICTIONAL WOMEN STRUGGLE TO CLIMB FROM UNDER THEIR MAN'S DOMINATION. YET, THESE STRONG SELF-RELIANT WOMEN ARE NOT FULLY ACCEPTED BY HEMINGWAY'S MALE CHARACTERS, LEAVING A PALPABLE TENSION BETWEEN HEMINGWAY'S FICTIONAL MEN AND WOMEN. THIS TENSION CAN BE ATTRIBUTED TO HEMINGWAY'S ONGOING LOVE/HATE RELATIONSHIP BETWEEN HIMSELF AND THE SELF-RELIANT WOMEN IN HIS LIFE. HEMINGWAY NEVER RECOVERS FROM THE EMOTIONAL DAMAGE INFLICTED BY HIS MOTHER, EVIDENT IN HIS PERSONAL LIFE AND IN THE DYSFUNCTIONAL RELATIONSHIPS IN HIS SHORT STORIES. HE REMAINS VIGILANT AND IS CONCERNED THAT HE WILL END UP LIKE HIS FATHER AND BE CONTROLLED BY A DOMINEERING BITCH. HOWEVER, HEMINGWAY EXERTS SO MUCH CONTROL IN HIS RELATIONSHIPS AND BECOMES A VERSION OF HIS MOTHER AS HE DOMINATES HIS SIGNIFICANT OTHERS. IN HIS LIFE, HE TRANSITIONS FROM AN ANGRY RESENTFUL CHILD-MAN TO A YOUNG HUSBAND, A RELUCTANT PARENT, A LADIES' MAN, AND AN ADVENTURER. LIKewise, HIS PERCEPTION AND PORTRAYAL OF WOMEN IN HIS SHORT STORIES KEEPS PACE WITH HIS PERSONAL EXPERIENCES. THESE FEMALE CHARACTERS SOMETIMES REFLECT THE WOMEN IN HIS LIFE AND SOMETIMES REFLECT HEMINGWAY'S INSECURITIES AS A MAN, AND OFTEN A SEAMLESS MELDING OF BOTH.

WOMEN WITHOUT MEN: HEMINGWAY'S FEMALE CHARACTERS 1905 ERNEST HEMINGWAY WROTE FOUR MAJOR NOVELS AND DOZENS OF SHORT STORIES DURING HIS LONG CAREER AS ONE OF AMERICA'S PREEMINENT TWENTIETH CENTURY WRITERS. BOTH DURING HIS LIFETIME AND AFTER HIS DEATH, CRITICS HAVE WRITTEN EXTENSIVELY ABOUT HIS WORK, ANALYZING IT, INTERPRETING IT, AND EVALUATING IT. PERHAPS THE MOST DEBATED ASPECT OF THE CANON IS HEMINGWAY'S TREATMENT OF FEMALE CHARACTERS. IN THE PAST, CRITICS TENDED TO ARRANGE HEMINGWAY'S HEROINES INTO CATEGORIES, FREQUENTLY DIVIDING THEM INTO TWO GROUPS: THE BITCHES AND THE GODDESSES. MORE RECENT CRITICISM ESCHEWS THE RESTRICTIONS OF CATEGORIES, FOCUSING ON THE WOMEN AS INDIVIDUALS AND ATTEMPTING TO EXPLAIN THEIR BEHAVIOR BY ANALYZING THEIR MOTIVATION. AN EXAMINATION OF HEMINGWAY'S LIFE AND SOME OF HIS WORK LEADS TO A BETTER UNDERSTANDING OF HIS DEPICTION OF WOMEN. BY LOOKING AT THE HEROINES OF THREE NOVELS--THE SUN ALSO RISES, A FAREWELL TO ARMS, AND FOR WHOM THE BELL TOLLS--AND FOUR SHORT STORIES--"UP IN MICHIGAN," "THE SHORT, HAPPY LIFE OF FRANCIS MACOMBER," "THE SNOWS OF KILIMANJARO," AND "HILLS LIKE WHITE ELEPHANTS"--WE CAN GAIN INSIGHT INTO HEMINGWAY'S FEMALE CHARACTERS AND INTO THE AUTHOR'S ATTITUDE TOWARD THEM. IN THE END, IT IS QUITE POSSIBLE TO SEE HEMINGWAY'S FEMALE CHARACTERS IN THE SAME LIGHT AS WE LOOK AT HIS MALE CHARACTERS--AS DEVELOPING HUMAN BEINGS CROSSING THE PLAIN AND MOVING THROUGH THE VALLEY ON THEIR WAY TO THE MOUNTAIN TOP, WHERE THOSE WHO ADHERE TO HEMINGWAY'S CODE LIVE OUT THEIR LIVES.
