Hess Art Collection Hess Collection 2009 The Hess Art Collection is one of the world's most distinguished private collections of contemporary art. It was assembled by the Swiss businessman and wine producer Donald M. Hess. The collection unites extraordinary works by numerous artists now known around the world as well as excellent pieces by artists whose names are (as yet) less well known. This mixture is part of the ensemble's particular charm, making a glance through this copiously illustrated catalogue a veritable expedition. Hess's collecting activities primarily focus on the individual work. Accompanied by an unmistakable sense of quality, he judiciously selected the works he acquired over a period of more than forty years. A large part of the collection's holdings is open to the public in the museums of the Hess wineries in Napa, California, Glen Carlou in Paarl, South Africa, and Bodega Colomé in Calchaquí Valley, Argentina. A fourth museum is being planned at the Peter Lehmann Winery in Barossa Valley, Australia.

Inspired by Laurie Anderson's class at Cal Arts, Kelley and Oursler's band was experimenting with ways to integrate visual arts with music. Group Dynamics Annegret Hoberg 2021-04-07 How Kandinsky, Marc, Kubin and others combined the folk arts of Germany and Russia with a new painterly ethos "The whole work, called art, knows no borders and peoples, but humanity," wrote artists Franz Marc and Wassily Kandinsky in the manifesto for their new collective in 1911. Dubbed Der Blaue Reiter (the Blue Rider), Marc and Kandinsky aimed to establish one of the first transnational artists' circles focused on a global understanding of art through words, images and actions. Until the outbreak of World War I in 1914, the group exhibited across Germany with pieces that favored inspiration from folk art and children's drawings over the prevailing artistic trends of

modernism. For this volume, the Lenbachhaus in Munich, Germany, honors the goals of the original participants of the Blue Rider--among them, Gabriele Münter, Alfred Kubin, Maria Marc and Elisabeth Epstein--by bringing their work together with a variety of pieces that influenced their credo, such as Japanese woodcuts and Bavarian and Russian folk art. Though the original members of the Blue Rider were not able to fully realize their goals of emancipating the art world from national affiliations and traditional hierarchies and genres, this volume conveys the extent of their aesthetic and ideological impact on art history.

Alex Katz Jacob Proctor 2019-02-28 Over a career that now spans nearly seven decades, the American painter Alex Katz (b. 1927, New York) has devoted himself to the representation of the here and now and to the immediacy of human perception - a commitment to what the artist has often described as "painting in the present tense." Alex Katz emerged on the New York scene in the 1950s during the heyday of Abstract Expressionism and just prior to the explosion of Pop Art, yet his unique aesthetic has always stood apart from other painters of his generation. Cy Twombly Photographs Cy Twombly 1993 Matthew Marks is pleased to announce his next exhibition will be Cy Twombly Photographs. The exhibition will consist of twenty-nine color photographs. This is the first time Twombly has exhibited work in this medium. Cy Twombly began experimenting with color photography in the early 1980s. About four years ago he started working with the master printers Michel and Jean-Francois Fresson at the Atelier Fresson in Savigny sur Orge, France. The Fresson technique is a unique photographic printing process carried on exclusively by the Fresson family since 1990. The photographs which result have an unusually rich surface and extraordinary, saturated colors over which the artist is able to maintain exceptional control. Fresson prints are the most permanent photographic color images made today. The subject matter of Twombly's photographs are flowers, trees and ancient Roman sculptures. The majority of the works in the exhibition have been put together by the artist into

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groups of five or six images. Theirs is similar to the way Twombly has presented his paintings and drawings in the past. While not as abstract as his work in other media, the photographs Twombly will show are close in feeling to his larger scale work and are important to an understanding of his subject matter and working methods. Naming the Gods Gary D. Astrachan 2019-11-29 Naming the Gods: Cy Twombly's Passionate Poiesis concerns itself with the contemporary art work of Cy Twombly as seen against the deep background of classical Greek mythology. In particular, the two entwined figures and images of Orpheus, lyre player, lover and journeyer to the underworld, and Dionysos/Bacchus, god of wine, ecstasy and madness, are taken up as the two principal thematic leitmotifs which animate and overarchingly inform Twombly's entire artistic oeuvre across all the mediums in which he worked, both literally and symbolically, from the early 1950's until the last series of brilliantly colored paintings he made just before his death in 2011. His preoccupations with the rhythms of language, poetry and writing on the one hand, and his tendencies towards wildly expressive gestural abstraction on the other, ultimately combine in his creation of a genuinely new and original performative aesthetic which unites and connects the powerful impulses of mark-making, painting and assembling with the basic human needs for individuation, realization and redemption. In a long and rich tradition of sublime poiesis spanning ancient Greek tragedy, through Romanticism, the poets Friedrich Hölderlin and Rainer Maria Rilke, and into our own fragmented and imperiled postmodernist times, Twombly's artistic corpus is viewed as providing a radically renovative relationship and practice for honoring, working with and valorizing both psyche and matter, the inner and outer worlds, as well as with delimiting a uniquely germinative and seminal space for the further enactment of creative human 'doing,' 'making,' 'pro-ucing,' and 'being,' in reciprocal and intimate relationship with the otherness of 'things,' nature and the environment. Gary D. Astrachan, Ph.D., is a clinical psychologist and Jungian psychoanalyst in private practice in Portland, Maine. He is a faculty member and supervising and training analyst at the C.G. Jung Institutes in Boston and in Switzerland and lectures and teaches widely throughout North America, Latin America and Europe. He is a founding member of the C.G. Jung Center of Brunswick, Maine, and is also an independent curator of contemporary art installations and exhibitions. He is the author of numerous scholarly articles in professional journals and books and writes particularly on the relationship between analytical psychology and Greek mythology, poetry, painting, film, postmodernism and critical theory.

Picasso Künstlerbücher Museum Brandhorst (Munich, Germany) 2010 English summary: Picasso was one of the most prolific artists of the 20th Century, including in the decorative art of book design. Between 1905 and 1973, he designed more than 150 books, the most important of which are shown in a superb exhibition at the Museum Brandhorst in Munich. The focus of the exhibition lies on Picasso's experimentation with techniques and expressive possibilities in this fascinating medium. This catalog and the exhibition present the artist's book by Picasso as a complex object, not as a commercial art. The universal artist scratched, cut, stabbed or drew illustrations, but he also wrote poems, dedications and political texts. Page sequences, layout and typography inspired him as much as book covers and slipcases. He used almost every previously known printing technique and drove new technologies to their limits. Pictures of side tracks, covers and slipcases clearly highlight the diversity of the medium.

Seitenabfolge, Layout, Typographie inspirierten ihn ebenso wie Bucheinbände und Schuber. Er benutzte fast jede bis dahin bekannte Drucktechnik und trieb neue Techniken an ihre Grenzen. Die ersten Illustrationen schuf Picasso auf Bitten seines Freundes, des Autors Max Jacob. Es folgten in kommenden Jahrzehnten Projekte mit Paul Eluard, Tristan Tzara, Pierre Reverdy und anderen. Picasso reagierte zudem auf die Einladungen bedeutender Verleger wie Pierre Andre Benoit, Iliazd und Georges Hugnet und schuf mit ihnen einige der schonsten Kuenstlerbuecher des 20. Jahrhunderts. Den entstandenen Buchkunstwerken merkt man die Freude ihrer Schopfer an jedem Detail an, sie kitzeln beim Durchblattern alle Sinne. Der Katalog "Pablo Picasso. Kunst am Buch" spuert dem Reiz nach, den Buecher auf Picasso und seine Freunde ausgeuebt haben. Aufnahmen von Seitenstrecken, Einbänden und Schubern machen die Vielfalt des Mediums anschaulich. Vertiefende Texte erlautern die Zusammenarbeit mit einzelnen Autoren und Verlegern und geben Einblick in einige der spannendsten Kuenstlerbuecher.

Gerhard Richter Gerhard Richter 2005 ohne Farbe stellt eine zentrale Werkgruppe im Schaffen von Gerhard Richter vor: Bilder, die ohne das eigentliche Material des Malers - die Farbe - auskommen. Die (Nicht-)Farben Schwarzweiß und Grau ziehen sich durch das gesamte Werk von Gerhard Richter: Das faszinierend weite Spektrum dieser Malerei ohne Farbe reicht zeitlich von den frühen sechziger Jahren bis heute, inhaltlich von den gegenständlichen, sich auf Schwarzweißfotos beziehenden Bildern bis zu vollkommen abstrakten Arbeiten. Grautöne genügen dem führenden Maler unserer Zeit, traditionelle Genres wie Historie, Porträts, Landschaften und Stilleben zu verhandeln und in grauen Schlierenbildern beziehungsweise Vermalungen, monochrom grauen Farbfeldbildern oder Spiegeln Grundfragen der Malerei nachzugehen. Es ergibt sich ein Querschnitt, der alles einschließt, was Malerei heute bedeuten kann - und dabei paradoxerweise im konsequenten Verzicht auf Farbe das Innerste der Malerei thematisiert.
