The December 1922 issue of his high school newspaper featured two of his stories, 'Golden Hope Christmas' and 'West is West'. In 1924 he sold his first piece - a short caveman tale titled 'Spear and Fang' - for \$16 to the not-yet-famous *Weird Tales* magazine. Howard's most famous character, Conan the Cimmerian, was a barbarian-turned-king during the Hyborian Age, a mythical period of some 12,000 years ago. Conan featured in seventeen *Weird Tales* stories between 1933 and 1936 which is why Howard is now regarded as having spawned the 'sword and sorcery' genre. The Conan stories have since been adapted many times, most famously in the series of films starring Arnold Schwarzenegger.
