Degree Gradation of Verbs Jens Fleischhauer-Helfer 2016-05-20 Gradation is usually considered to be a property of adjectives. Hahn succeeded in enriching a preparation until it was more than 100,000 times as intensive in its radiation as the same quantity of thorium.

The span from German colonialism to World War I brings these explosive periods into relief and challenges readers to think about the intersection of nationalism, violence and gender and about the historical continuities and disruptions that shape such events.

Atmospheric Architectures Gernot Böhme 2017-10-12 There is fast-growing awareness of the role atmospheres play in architecture. Beards and Texts Sebastian Coxon 2021-09-08 *Beards and Texts* explores the literary portrayal of beards in medieval German texts from the mid-twelfth to the early sixteenth centuries. It argues that as the pre-eminent symbol for masculinity the beard played a distinctive role throughout the Middle Ages in literary discussions of such major themes as majesty and humanity. At the same time beards served as an important point of reference in didactic poetry concerned with wisdom, teaching and learning, and in comedic texts that were designed to make their audiences laugh, not least by submitting various figure-types to the indignity of having their beards manhandled. The book concludes by reviewing the portrayal of Jesus in vernacular German literature, which represents a special test-case in the literary history of beards. As the first study of its kind in medieval German studies, this investigation submits beard-motifs to sustained and detailed analysis in order to shed light both on medieval poetic techniques and the normative construction of masculinity in a wide range of literary genres.

Greek Vases in the J. Paul Getty Museum J. Paul Getty Museum 1983 The Getty Museum houses an exceptional collection of ancient painted vases. This volume, fifth in the series, follows the direction taken by preceding volumes by introducing previously unpublished information about the works. Concepts, Frames and Cascades in Semantics, Cognition and Ontology Sebastian Löbner 2021-05-28 This open access book presents novel theoretical, empirical and experimental work exploring the nature of mental representations that support natural language production and understanding, and other manifestations of cognition. One fundamental question raised in the text is whether requisite knowledge structures can be adequately modeled by means of a uniform representational format, and if so, what exactly is its nature.
