Als die Abgeordneten des ersten deutschen Parlaments 1848 in die Frankfurter Paulskirche einziehen, befinden sich unter ihnen mit den Brüdern Max und Heinrich, der zum Präsidenten gewählt wird, gleich zwei Mitglieder der Familie von Gagern.
