Animal Beauty Christiane Nusslein-Volhard 2019-05-14 An illustrated exploration of colors and patterns in the animal kingdom, what they communicate, and how they function in the social life of animals. have not been a research priority—perhaps because they appeared to be nonessential luxuries rather than functional necessities—Nüsslein-Volhard looks at recent scientific developments on the topic. In part because of Nüsslein-Volhard's own research on the zebrafish, it is now possible to decipher the molecular genetic mechanisms that lead to production of colors in animal skin and its appendages and control its pattern and distribution.
