Violent Resistance Corinna Jentsch 2022-01-13 Why do communities form militias to defend themselves against violence during civil war? Using original interviews with former combatants and civilians and archival material from extensive fieldwork in Mozambique, Corinna Jentsch's *Violent Resistance* explains the timing, location and process through which communities form militias.
