Dante's Lyric Redemption Tristan Kay 2016-01-28 Dante's Lyric Redemption offers a re-examination of two strongly interrelated aspects of the poet's work: the role and value he ascribes to earthly love and his relationship to the Romance lyric tradition of his time. It argues that an account of Dante's poetic journey that posits a stark division between earthly and divine love, and between the secular lyric poet and the Christian auctor, does little justice to his highly distinctive and often polemical handling of these categories. The book firstly contextualizes, traces, and accounts for Dante's intriguing commitment to love poetry, from the 'minor works' to the *Commedia*. It highlights his attempts, especially in his masterpiece, to overcome normative oppositions in formulating a uniquely redemptive vernacular poetics, one oriented towards the eternal while rooted in his affective, and indeed erotic, past. It then examines how this matter is at stake in Dante's treatment of three important lyric predecessors: Guittone d'Arezzo, Arnaut Daniel, and Folco of Marseilles. Through a detailed reading of Dante's engagement with these poets, the book illuminates his careful departure from a dualistic model of love and conversion and shows his erotic commitment to be at the heart of his claims to pre-eminence as a vernacular author.

Fino agli eccessi del black metal di gruppi come Pandemia o alla parodia di Bella ciao trasformata nella Canzone dell’amuchina: “Un’amuchina / mi son comprato / virus ciao / virus ciao / virus ciao ciao ciao”. E su tutto aleggiano, per ricordare la gravità di ciò che ha cambiato per sempre molte delle nostre abitudini, le sonorità misteriose e ipnotiche di Björk che in Virus sussurra “Come un virus ha bisogno di un corpo... io busso alla tua pelle ed entro”. Fortunatamente lei parlava d’amore.

Freestone saw the fame arrive and with it the generosity, the excess, and the celebrity friends who came and went. “I was chief cook and bottle washer, waiter, butler, valet, secretary, amanuensis, cleaner, baby-sitter... and agony aunt,” he writes. “I shopped for him both at supermarkets and art markets, I travelled the world with him, I was with him at the highs and came through the lows with him. I saw the creative juices flow and I also saw the frustration when life wasn’t going well.
