Although our approach shares certain affinities with other neo-constructionist approaches, a novel proposal we advance in this book is that exponents are housed in an intermediate level of structure that exists between the narrow syntax and its external interfaces. This exponency-level ( $\Sigma$ -structure) allows for a more parsimonious theoretical analysis that does not sacrifice descriptive adequacy.
