Estava presente, em 1970, na estreia mundial de uma obra-prima do cinema, o Rei Lear, de Grigori Kosintsev, e conversou longamente com o diretor. Tinha uma intimidade com a obra e o universo do Bardo que não era menor do que a dos maiores especialistas em todo o mundo. Era reconhecida e respeitada internacionalmente em uma época em que as conferências internacionais eram reduto reservado aos eruditos. Ninguém, portanto, mais qualificado para traduzir a obra, retendo as imagens, a gramática, o tom e até os silêncios das peças. Sem mencionar a grande vantagem que é poder ler uma obra dramática completa da pena de um mesmo e excepcional tradutor. Os dois primeiros volumes foram totalmente revistos, com a inclusão de novas notas. O terceiro volume será publicado agora pela primeira vez, incluindo traduções inéditas. A propósito, este volume apresenta uma peça inédita, Eduardo III, a última tradução feita por Barbara Heliodora, pouco antes de falecer. Como o prestígio cultural de Shakespeare é indubitavelmente enorme, de tempos em tempos, surgem peças que são atribuídas a ele. Inicialmente, Barbara não se convenceu de que essa tragédia histórica tivesse sido escrita por Shakespeare, apesar de ter entrado oficialmente no cânone shakespeareano no final da década de 1990. Depois de muita leitura e pesquisa, Barbara se convenceu de que havia muito da mão do Bardo, ainda jovem, mas já revelando a promessa de grande escritor que viria a se tornar. A inclusão da inédita peça Eduardo III enriquece enormemente esta edição. Com novo projeto gráfico, com o miolo impresso em papel bíblia e com os três volumes embalados em uma caixa requintada e exclusiva, o TEATRO COMPLETO constitui um verdadeiro presente para todos aqueles que se interessam por cultura e pela reflexão ou investigação das paixões, dos mistérios, das contradições da alma humana desde sempre. Suas peças, personagens e linguagem permeiam o modo de pensar o mundo e, sobretudo, de compreender o próprio indivíduo, impactando pensadores, escritores e leitores do século XVII até hoje.
